Fertilizer Found Locally

Finding a fertilizer that complies with local fertilizer ordinances can be a challenge. We visited several garden centers and retail plant nurseries in St. Lucie County to locate fertilizers that conform to the requirements of the fertilizer ordinances. This is not a complete list, but is intended to be used as a guide. Please check with your local garden center or retail plant nursery to see what is available.

The fertilizer ordinances: St. Lucie County, City of Fort Pierce, City of Port St. Lucie and St. Lucie Village all have a black-out period from June 1st through September 30th in which no fertilizer containing Nitrogen (N) or Phosphorus (P) may be applied to lawns and landscapes. Between October 1st and May 30th fertilizers containing 50% slow-release Nitrogen and no Phosphorus may be applied to lawns and landscapes.
