**Joshua J. Revord, Director of PIB**

Meet Joshua J. Revord, Director of Port, Inlet & Beaches (PIB) for St. Lucie County. Mr. Revord considers himself a native of St. Lucie County (moved here when he was 4) and previously worked as the County's Sr. Coastal Engineer. Mr. Revord's new role as PIB Director includes previous responsibilities (managing the Erosion District for the County - a dependent special taxing district focused on coastal management) and assisting in the development of the Port of Fort Pierce.

As Director of PIB, Mr. Revord helps to identify and initiate coastal initiatives and port development strategies for the County. This typically involves the development and oversight of projects from concept to completion. This role also includes building relationships with stakeholders, regulatory authorities, and local, state, and federal policy makers to ensure the County's objectives are addressed in a timely fashion. As PIB Director, Mr. Revord also assists with the County's relationship with Derecktor Shipyards (a tenant servicing mega yachts at the port) and oversees various aspects of the long-term management of the Fort Pierce Inlet.

Mr. Revord is a registered professional engineer in the state of Florida and has a bachelor's degree in Ocean Engineering from the Florida Institute of Technology and a master's degree in Coastal and Oceanographic Engineering from the University of Florida (Go Gators!).

Mr. Revord currently serves as a Director for the Florida Shore and Beach Preservation Association (FSBPA), sits on the Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic Development (FSTED) Council, is Chair of the FSTED Council Seaport Environmental Management (SEMC) Committee, and is Chair of St. Lucie County's Resiliency Steering Committee. Mr. Revord has worked for St. Lucie County for over 9 years and calls the County home with his wife Madison and 5 young boys.
